




Enquiry Question: How can we share messages with others through artwork?

We will be taking photographs of our own pieces of art, resizing and editing them, to share our artwork with others across the trust.

Using our voices: Within our music unit this this half term we will be developing vocal control, learning different singing styles and coordinating actions and signing to go along side them. We will also build on our knowledge of musical terms, how songs are structured and appreciate music and the way it makes us feel when we hear it.
